

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

What is the WIL Digital Subsidy?

ICTC's WIL Digital is an innovative Work Integrated Learning program that helps employers grow their businesses by providing financial assistance for hiring post-secondary students.

WIL Digital is funded by the Government of Canada's Student Work Placement Program (SWPP) and provides the following wage subsidy types:

- . 50% of the student's salary, up to \$5,000; or
- 70% of the student's salary, up to \$7,000, if the student falls within one of the following under-represented groups: Women in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), Indigenous students, recent immigrants, students with disabilities, and firstyear students.

Employer Eligibility Criteria

- I Hiring an eligible student as an employee in an IT or a digital-tech related position, including business development, digital marketing or technical sales.
- 🗹 Registered business, not-for-profit organization or post-secondary institution in Canada

You are hiring for a Net New* position

"Net New is determined by subtracting the number of students hired in a fiscal year prior to first participating in the WIL Digital Program and the number of students the company is intending to hire in the current fiscal year, including those already hired. For example, if the company hired 3 students in the fiscal year (April 1 to March 31) prior to participating in the WIL Digital program, then the company must intend to hire 4 students in this fiscal year to qualify for I subsidy.

ICTC's WIL Digital supports Canadian businesses that offer student work placements within the Digital Economy.



The objective of the Student Work Placement Program is to drive systemic change in the skills development system at the post-secondary education level, to effectively align technical, foundational and "work-ready" skills of PSE students with the skills required by Canadian employers.

This will be demonstrated by:

- an increase in new, sustainable work-integrated learning (WIL) opportunities for students across all disciplines; and
- continuation of collaborative partnerships between employers and the PSE system established under the program upon sunsetting.



WIL Digital Wage Subsidies

Current ESDC SWPP funding amounts for employers to recieve:
50% up to \$5000 – regular student
70% up to \$7000 – under-represented

Canada

Funded by the Government of Canada Student Work Placement Program

Employer & Position Eligibility Criteria

Employers must be:

- A private business, NGO, Charities, registered business number
- Be registered in Canadian
- Provide a safe workplace
- Have general liability insurance
- Hire the student on payroll and not as a contractor

Position must be:

- IT or IT-related
- 16 weeks (flexible) hours
- At workplace (remote permitted post Covid)
- Improve the student employability in the future through learning opportunities.






Student eligibility

- Canadian post secondary institution
- Full time or part time
 - College, undergraduate, masters, PhD
 - STEM, Business, Arts, Humanities or Social Science programs
- Legally entitled to work in Canada
 - Canadian citizen
 - Permanent resident
 - Protected as defined by the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act
- No age limit

Note: The SWPP program is not currently available for international students

Employers are eligible to receive a wage subsidy for providing a postsecondary student a meaningful WIL opportunity in the information technology or IT-related sectors.

Most Common Reasons for Declining

- International student
- Student was hired as a contractor not a company employee
- Position didn't qualify, no ICT/Digital aspects of the job
- Student is taking a break from school and not enrolled in next school term
- The student is employer's direct family member.





Application Submission Process



WIL.Digital – 6 easy steps

Employer creates a company profile on Survey- Monkey platform Employer fills in the company profile form and provides the information necessary for subsidy transfer.

Employer completes a Placement information form.

Student completes a Student Information form and submits the supporting documents.

CTIC team reviews the application (allow about 10 working days).

The application is approved and the contract is issued.
